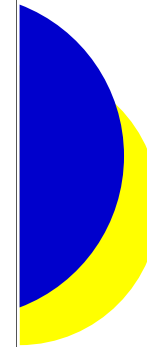
NORTH COUNTY ATHLETIC PHILOSOPHY

NORTH COUNTY ATHLETIC INFORMATION

Eligibility-Quick Facts (Also refer to the North County Student-Athlete Handbook for a complete list)

1. High School Students must earn 3.0 credits from the previous semester to be eligible to play the next semester
2. Incoming freshmen students must have been successfully promoted from the 8th grade to be eligible for the 1st semester.
3. High School Students must be enrolled in classes that will accumulate 3.0 credits in the current semester
4. Students *must* have on file with the school and coach a physical and parent permission (on the physical form provided by the school) before the 1st day of practice. (forms can be found on the activities site)

Significant Dates

August 8, 2011: 1st day of fall practice (High School)

August 18, 2011: 1st day of school

August tba, 2011: 1st day of fall practice (Middle School)

October 7, 2011: Fall Homecoming

October 31, 2011: 1st day of winter practice (Middle School and HS Wrestling)

November 7, 2011: 1st day of winter practice (High School)

February 27, 2011: 1st day of spring practice (High and Middle School)

Parent/Coach Communication

1. Parents are asked to have the student-athlete discuss concerns with the coach first
2. Coaches are not to be approached by parents the afternoon or evening after a game. The coach is responsible for the safety of the students after the game and is not expected to discuss concerns with parents after a game.
3. Parents may contact coaches via email or phone after the student-athlete has spoken with the coach to follow-up with the conversation. The coach is expected to respond to these requests.
4. Topics that are not up for discussion: playing time, strategy or other students.

APPROPRIATE ISSUES TO DISCUSS WITH COACHES

1. The mental and physical treatment of the child
2. Ways to help your child improve
3. Concerns about your child's behavior

COLLEGIATE SCHOLARSHIPS North County High School was fortunate to have two young men, Will (2007 High School Football All-American) and Cody Compton (2009 High School Wrestling National Champion), who earned Division I scholarships. Here is some advice from their parents, Bill and Kathey Compton, about the approach they took on finding scholarship opportunities. It is great advice for those interested in this path:

1. Do not assume that colleges will find you. Be proactive in getting your child involved with camps.
2. Check with the High School Counselors to make sure the student has the appropriate credits to be eligible.
3. Understand what scholarships are available at each level and specific sport.
4. Take an honest evaluation from a college coach at a college sponsored camp.

PLAYING TIME

Playing time is not to be discussed with coaches. However, if the player would like to know how to improve as a player, here are the proper channels:

1. The student-athlete needs to set up a time to speak to the coach. This needs to be in a setting where only the coaches and player are present. This does not need to occur during practice or game time. Coaches are expected to set-up an appropriate meeting time to do this and are expected to provide specific information to improve the player.
2. After the meeting between coach and player occurs, if the parent needs clarification on the conversation to improve, they may set-up an appropriate time to meet with the coach. Practice and games are not appropriate settings.

The goal of the North County Athletic Department is to develop great communication between the coach and player to develop a strong team. Successful businesses and organizations have great communication among their staff and our Athletic Department believes this is a great path to success. Coaches and players must feel comfortable in communicating with each other to have a successful season.
